




**▲ ABOUT THE PROGRAM**

The School of Medicine for International Students is a newly established four-year M.D. program (taught in English for Bachelor's degree) in compliance with the government policy that aims to cultivate passionate and devoted international medical professionals for countries that have a diplomatic relationship with Taiwan. Students are conferred only a Bachelor's diploma in English upon graduation and must return to their home countries after graduation, and students are not allowed to take the medical licensing examination or to conduct medical practice in Taiwan.

▲ ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicants who have a bachelor's degree or above conferred by a local or foreign university recognized by the R.O.C. Ministry of Education may apply for admission; those who have studied at the School of Medicine, Dentistry or Chinese Medicine for four years or more may apply with credentials of an equivalent education level. The original diploma (or academic credentials) verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission must be submitted upon registration and enrollment (if the diploma (or academic credentials) is in a language other than Chinese or English, a Chinese or English translation verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission or a registered translation agency is required); otherwise, an applicant will be considered disqualified and denied admission.
2. Pursuant to Paragraph 1 of Article 2 in the *MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan*, applicants who have a foreign nationality, have never had the nationality of the Republic of China* ("R.O.C."), and do not have an overseas Chinese student status at the time of application may apply for admission.
3. Any matter not mentioned herein should be subject to the MOE Program of Assisting Countries with Diplomatic Relations in Cultivating Medical Talents, the *MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan*, and the *MOE Regulations Governing the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Records by Institutions of Higher Education*.

▲ HOW TO APPLY

1. No application fee is required for applying for admission to this Program.
2. Application Documents
 - (1) An application must be completed not later than March 15, 2019.
Please fill out an application form online (<https://enroll.isu.edu.tw/DP>) and print it out. The application form and required documents must be submitted to ISU by the aforesaid deadline.
 - (2) Applicants may submit the application packet through either of the following methods:

3. TaiwanICDF Scholarship
 - (1) Only applications submitted on the following website will be considered: http://web.icdf.org.tw/ICDF_TSP/WelcomeStart.aspx.
 - (2) Those who want to apply for the TaiwanICDF Scholarship must complete the online application form first, and then print out and submit it to the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission on their own.
4. Notes:
 - (1) The application process will not be considered completed until an applicant has completed both an application for admission to this Program and an application for the TaiwanICDF Scholarship.
 - (2) Late applications, unqualified applications or incomplete submission of documents will not be considered by ISU.
 - (3) Please keep an extra copy of all documents submitted for application as ISU will not return the originals to applicants.

▲ SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS FOR APPLICATION

1. A completed application form in print (including a signed affidavit)
2. A photocopy of the applicant's passport
3. A diploma of bachelor's degree or above, or the proof of an education level equivalent to studies at the School of Medicine, Dentistry or Chinese Medicine for four years or more, as well as an academic transcript
4. The proof of having earned at least 6 course credits on biology, chemistry or life sciences (A bachelor's degree in life sciences is a plus.)
5. A certificate of English proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS or other English proficiency tests recognized globally or by the local government and taken within the most recent 2 years)
6. An English autobiography
7. Three recommendation letters
8. Other supporting documents:
 - (1) The medical school admission exam result (MCAT, BMAT or GAMSAT) within the most recent 3 years
 - (2) Practical experience in health care and laboratories
 - (3) Experience in volunteer service
